



Here are some suggestions of how you could do it: Create stars by flicking paint onto paper using an old toothbrush or using an old spray bottle. Create planets by swirling paint together or putting drops of food colouring into shaving foam and laying paper on it.</p>	<p>Activity: Lesson 1: Jigsaw Piece 1 (Challenge) Jigsaw Jenie asks how did you find that challenge? How did it make you feel? Was it easy? Read one of the suggested stories or one similar with the theme of not giving up when faced with a challenge. Questions: How did you find that challenge? How did it make you feel? Was it easy? Talk about how sometimes we may come across things that are difficult. Understanding the World

Create a 'moon rocks' investigation box. Inside a cardboard box, place some pebbles (real or salt dough) along with magnifying glasses, tweezers and bowls. Cut holes in the side of the box for children to place their hands through and investigate the moon rocks.


Provide children with torches and encourage them to explore light and dark. Talk about things that can be seen at night or in the dark.

Talk through this [EYFS Famous Astronauts PowerPoint](#). Look at the different famous astronauts and talk to the children about important contributions they have made.

Encourage interaction with the outdoors by fostering a fascination with the moon. Invite children to look outside their window before bed each night and observe the moon. Can they notice any changes and discuss these with their friends at the end of the week?

Small World Area

Set up a space-themed small world tray. Encourage the children to use the characters and objects to act out a storyline.

Outdoor Area

Bikes, trikes, chalk, building using bricks, tyres and crates.
